The El Dorado Union High School District is pleased to announce that it is able to offer an alternative education program on the Union Mine High School campus for district students. The program is personalized and designed to offer students who are 16 or older the opportunity to

“repair” their academic status, make up graduation credit deficiencies, and potentially transition back into the regular Union Mine program. In addition, students will have access to district ROP programs, work experience education, and elective and community college courses. Students will be assessed and placed in an individualized academic program through the services of an administrator, guidance counselor, and a team of two teachers.

Goals for Mountain View

- To provide an opportunity for students to complete the required academic courses of instruction to graduate from high school
- To provide a program of instruction which emphasizes occupational orientation or a work-study schedule and offers intensive guidance services to meet the special needs of students as they prepare post secondary plans
- To provide a program designed to meet the educational needs of each student, including regional occupational programs, work study, career counseling, and job placement services, as a supplement to classroom instruction

- To provide referrals for support and/or rehabilitative services for students.
- To provide an academic progress and counseling review program that:
 - * Ensures that each student receives a systematic review of his or her academic progress and counseling regarding the educational options available to the student during their final years of high school.
 - * Ensures that each student has a meeting with a counselor that also includes the student’s parent or guardian and details the educational options available to that student, academic progress needed for satisfactory completion of high school, and the effect of that coursework and academic progress upon the student’s options for post secondary education and employment.
 - * Ensures that the program give first priority to students who are not earning credits at a rate which enable them to graduate with the rest of their class.



The Mountain View High School academic program will include:

- Pre-Post Assessment
- Individual Learning Plans
- Core Curriculum
- Elective Opportunities at UMHS
- Problem and Project based learning
- Self-paced courses
- Computer Assisted Instruction
- Guest speakers and “guest” instructors
- Field trips to survey ROP program offerings, community colleges, CSU and UC campuses, major El Dorado County employers, etc.
