Where can I find the Union Mine High School Website?

When does school start?

- Here is the 2021-2022 EDUHSD Student Calendar.
 - This year, school will start on Monday, August 9, 2021.
 - The last day of school is Friday, May 27, 2022.
 - Please note various non-school and holidays.
 - Please plan vacations accordingly. Students are expected to attend final exams during the designated final exam time.

What is the UMHS Bell Schedule?

When can I create a Parent Aeries Portal?

• You will be contacted in the summer (sometime in July or August) with the information you need to create an account.

How does Union Mine High School communicate with the learning community?

• UMHS uses Parent Square as the platform for communication.

When will I receive a Parent Square account/invite?

- Once a Parent Aeries Portal is created, the parent/guardian will need to add oneself as a contact in the Contacts section in Aeries and designate "Lives With".
- Once this step is completed, an invite will be sent to the email address on file 24 hours after.

Are students issued lockers at Union Mine High School?

- Lockers are only available for students enrolled in PE for gym class.
- Students in PE will have access to lockers assigned by their teacher.

Are students issued chromebooks at Union Mine High School?

- UMHS is a 1:1 school for student devices.
 - Students who need a chromebook to borrow for the year will be issued a device early in the year.
 - Students who have a device from home are permitted to bring that device to school to access online learning resources.

What are the Graduation Requirements for the El Dorado Union High School District and Union Mine High School?

What is the 4x4 Block Schedule?

- UMHS runs a 4x4 schedule where students take 3-4 classes in the fall (August December) and 3-4 classes in the spring (January May).
- The 4x4 allows students to focus time on fewer classes at a time to learn the material on a deeper level. This mirrors a college schedule and creates more opportunities for students to accelerate and remain focused on a smaller course load.
- By the end of the year students will have completed 6-8 classes just as students do on a traditional schedule at other campuses.

Can I choose which classes are in the fall and which classes are in the spring?

- Students will choose the 8 courses they would like for the year. Their counselor will choose based on the classes offered in the master schedule which classes the student will take in the fall and in the spring.
- Counselors do their best to look over each schedule to balance the load of academic courses and elective courses to allow students to have the time to devote to rigorous classes.

Is a Language Other Than English (LOTE) a graduation requirement?

- Contrary to what some might think, a LOTE is not required to graduate from UMHS.
- However, two years of the same LOTE are required by most universities to be eligible to apply for university admissions. The UC/CSU systems, for example, require two years of the same LOTE as a minimum eligibility requirement.

Which level English should my incoming ninth grader take?

- Union Mine High School has three English classes for incoming freshmen: English 1, Advanced English 1, and yearlong Read 180 with English 1. All classes are college preparatory and are accepted by UC/CSU for college admission.
- Read 180 with English 1 should only be selected if your student needs ongoing reading support to access grade level curriculum.
- Middle School teachers make recommendations based on current mastery of skills and anticipated skills needed.

If my student takes English I as a freshman, is Advanced English 2 available to my student during sophomore year?

• Yes. A student may take English 1 in freshman year and Advanced English 2 in sophomore year.

What is the math placement criteria for incoming freshmen?

• <u>Here</u> is the 9th Grade Mathematics Placement Criteria.

What is Algebra Foundations?

• Algebra Foundations should only be selected if your student struggles with basic math principles and number fluency. Students who have earned average grades (C or better) in middle school math should take Algebra 1 or higher. Math placement will also be based on middle school teacher recommendation.

What is the ICT Foundations class?

- Information and Communications Technology (ICT) Foundations is a 9 week semester-long class. It meets the EDUHSD graduation requirement. This class is paired with the other 9 week semester-long graduation requirement, Health.
- Students who take PLTW 1- Honors Principles of Engineering (POE) in lieu of ICT will meet the graduation requirement. The course description for PLTW can be found on page 32 of this <u>document</u>.

How do I purchase PE clothes?

• UMHS does not have AP classes available to freshmen.

Is the School Office/Counseling Office open during the summer?

- The School Office/Counseling Office has modified hours during the summer.
