Early Assessment Program (EAP)

The EAP provides students with an early indicator of their college readiness in English and math prior to starting the senior year. In addition, EAP may earn students an exemption from the CSU and participating CCC English and/or mathematics placement tests that are required for entering freshmen. EAP is now embedded in the CAASPP grade eleven ELA and mathematics assessments.

At the end of the Smarter Balanced English and math tests, students will be asked whether or not they want to release their results to the CSU and CCCs. Students should mark the check box that indicates their understanding that their CAASPP/EAP results will be shared directly with the CSU and/or the CCC. The results will not be used for admissions, only for placement into English and Math classes.

ASVAB Career Exploration

The ASVAB Career Exploration Program provides high quality, career exploration and planning materials at no cost to high schools throughout the country. The Program encourages students to explore a wide variety of careers, rather than limiting their exploration by telling them what they can or should do.

Students explore occupations in line with their interests and skills. In addition, they can compare their academic preparation against the requirements for entry into desired programs of study or occupations. In this way, they develop effective strategies to realize their career goals. The ASVAB test is the most widely used multiple-aptitude test battery in the world. The ASVAB tests in eight different areas. The test has proven to be a good measure of how students have developed both academic and occupational skills. It also measures aptitudes that are related to success in different jobs as well as training and education programs.

The heart of the ASVAB Career Exploration Program is the interpretation session. This session is run by trained Education Services Specialists or counselors. The interpretation sessions are held during the Dback following the ASVAB.

There is NO military obligation from taking the ASVAB!
