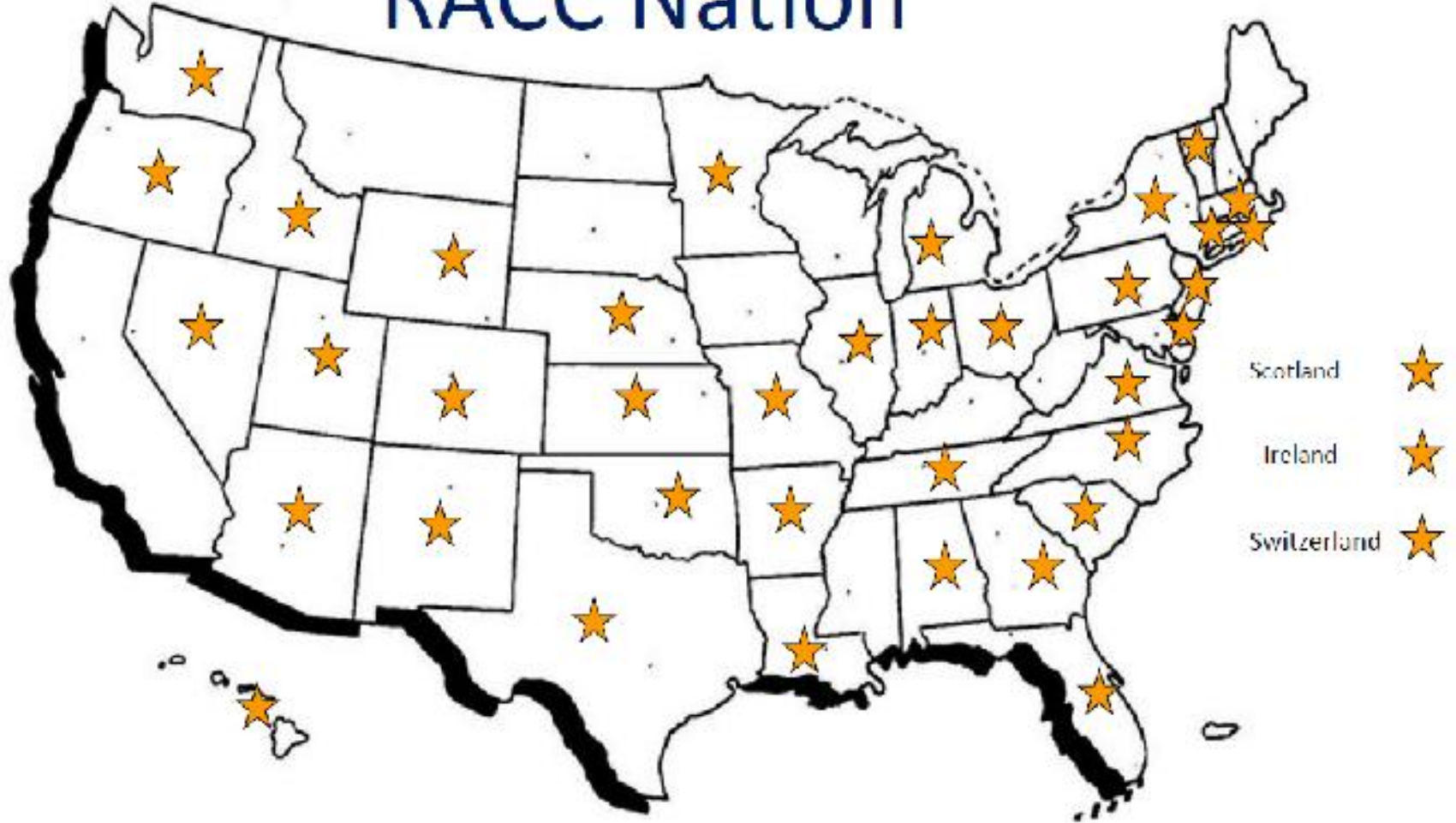

Creating Options In Your College Search

2012-13 Total Costs

- **Average UC Cost =** **\$31,700**
(UC Web Site www.universityofcalifornia.edu)
- **Average CSU Cost =** **\$23,811**
(CSU Web Site www.calstate.edu/sas/costofattendance)
- **Average Public Out-of-State Cost =** **\$29,682**
- **Private School Cost =** **\$43,289**
(college board – 80% receive scholarships and/or grants, **net cost = \$27,600**)

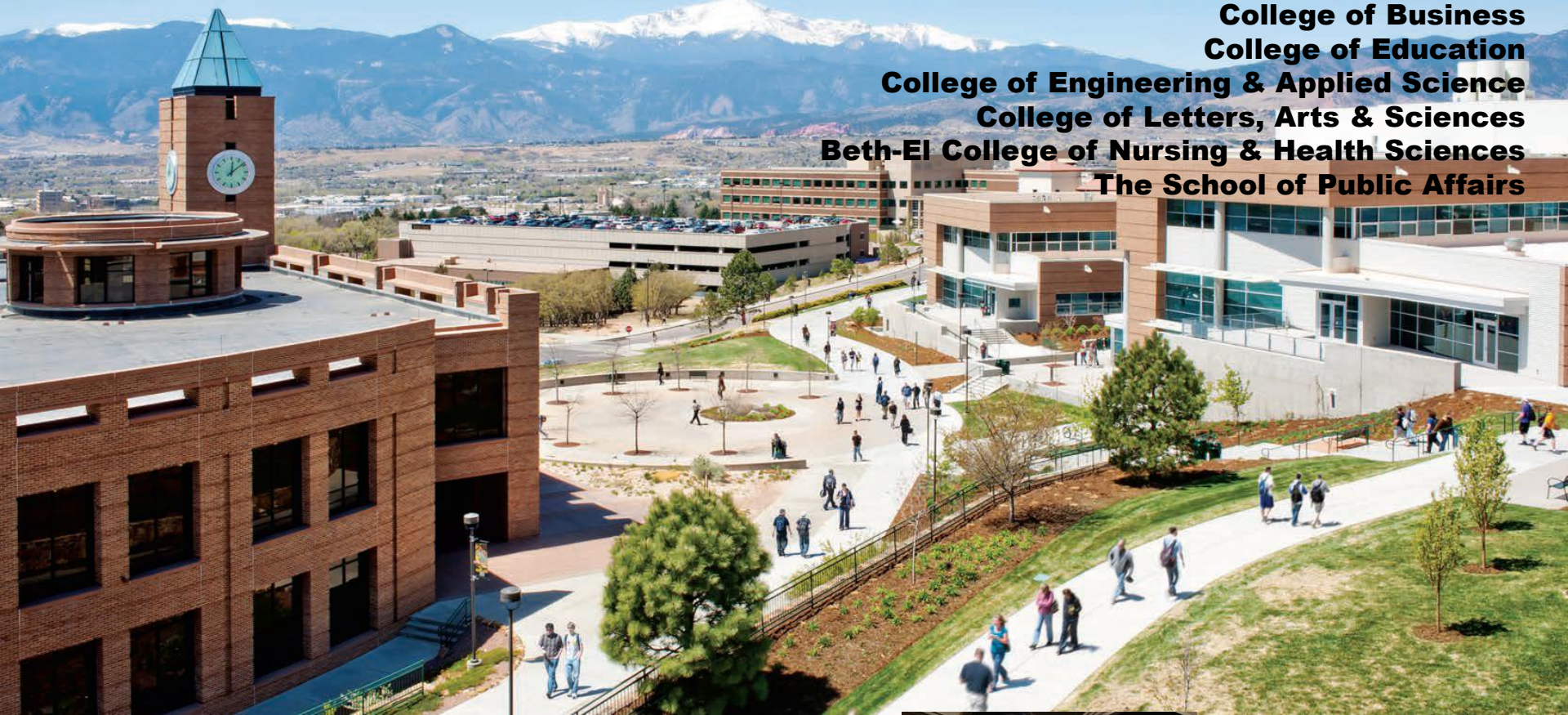

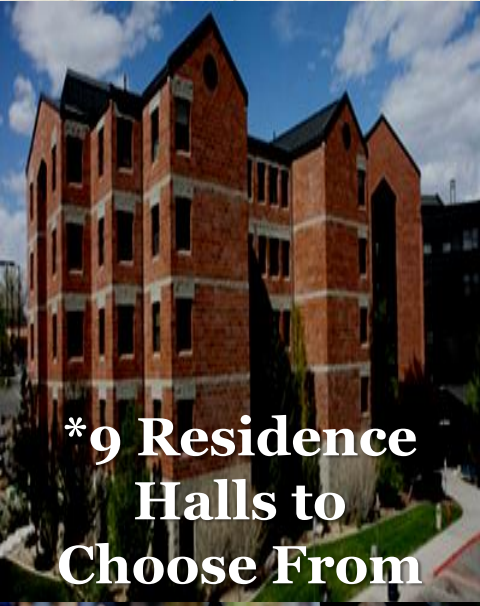

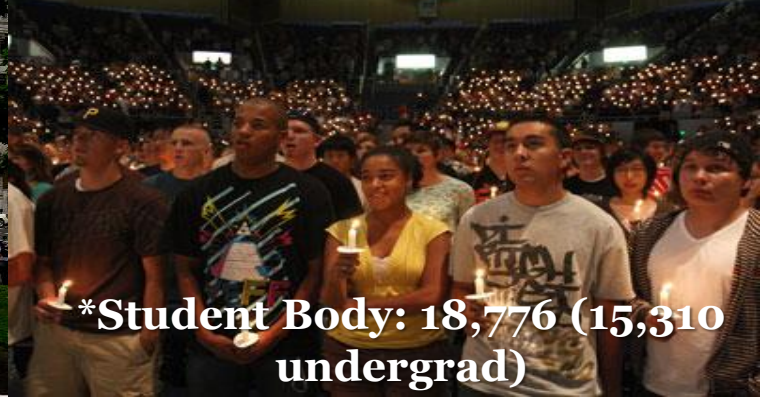

Admission Requirements

- New Freshman:
 - 3.0 academic GPA (weighted)
 - Core Courses:
 - English: 4 years
 - Math: 3 years (4 years recommended)
 - Natural Science: 3 years (4 years recommended)
 - Social Science: 3 years

Academic GPA waiver: Core plus 22 ACT or 1040 SAT I (reading and math only)



The University of Nevada is also a part of the **WUE** program for incoming freshman, students must:

- live on campus **AND**
- have a **3.0 academic gpa AND**
- Attain an **1100** SAT (CR&M only) or **22** ACT Composite

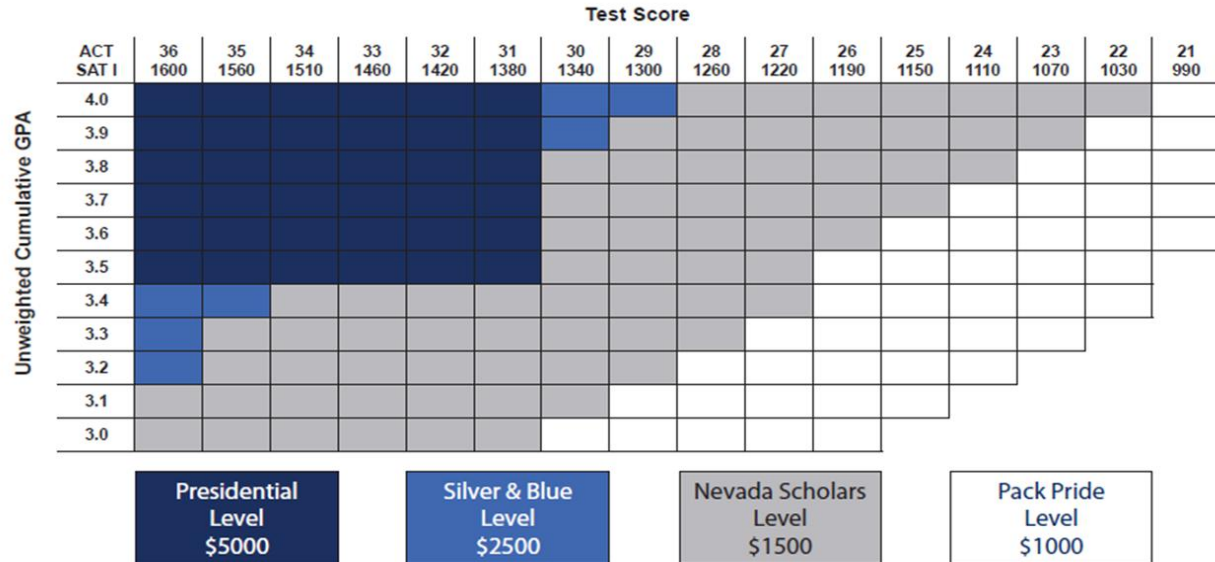
