

"Test Optional" vs "Test Blind"

What does "Test Optional" mean? The student chooses whether or not to submit SAT/ACT

If you are unable or chose not to submit test scores, your application will still receive full consideration.

Schools that are Test Optional may use SAT/ACT scores for:

- Admissions: Some campuses may choose to consider your test scores as part of their application review process.
- Scholarships: Some scholarships may include test scores as a factor in selection.
- Course placement after you enroll.

What does "Test Blind" mean? This means that colleges will not accept standardized testing (SAT or ACT) as part of their admissions process.

These scores will not be looked at when deciding if a student is accepted to the school.

However, schools that are Test Blind may use SAT/ACT scores to determine the following:

- Scholarships. Some scholarships may include test scores as a factor in selection.
- Course placement after you enroll.

What Are the Systems of Higher Education?

In general, there are four different systems of higher education:

- 1. 2-year institutions
- 2. Public 4-year institutions
- 3. Private 4-year institutions
- 4. Vocational/technical schools

Nationwide, there are thousands of colleges offering a wide variety of degrees and majors.

Liberal arts colleges aim to give you broad exposure to different subject matter and help you build a well-rounded skill set that can be applied to many different professional pursuits.

Professional or technical schools focus more narrowly on preparing you for a specific career or professional pathway.

When you consider higher education, you have to think about your goals and the type of experience you hope to have when you get there.

What type of college is the best fit for me?

Do you already know what job you are hoping to pursue, or do you need some time to figure it out? Are you hoping for small classes and lots of interaction with your professors? Or would you prefer to be on a large campus with larger lecture-style courses? Are you interested in entering the workforce as quickly as possible? Your answers to these questions should factor into how you focus your research on the systems of higher education.

California's higher education sector includes three public systems:

- University of California (UC)
- California State University (CSU)
- California Community Colleges (CCC)

There are also more than 150 private, nonprofit colleges in California. In addition, roughly 200 institutions in California are private and for-profit. In total, California's colleges and universities enroll more than 2 million students from all different backgrounds.

Application:

- Essays and Letters of Recommendation from teachers and your Counselor are usually required
 - Seniors applying through the Common Application should complete a <u>BRAG SHEET</u> in Fall 2020.
 You can use this sheet to list your awards, achievements, and grades. You will then share this sheet with the people you want to write your letters of recommendation.
- Check with each campus to see if they require standardized testing.

Some campuses use Early Action vs Early Decision for admissions.





Key Vocabulary

* ED (Early Decision)

- → Binding: if you are accepted you are obligated to attend
- → Usually a November deadline with decision in December
- → Students will either be accepted, denied or deferred for reconsideration later

* EA (Early Action)

- → Non-binding: not obligated to attend the school if you get in
- → Can apply to multiple schools EA
- → Receive decisions earlier but do not need to accept until May 1

* Restricted EA (Early Action)

→ Restrictive or single choice EA limits your EA admissions plan to one school

* RD (Regular Decision) MOST COMMONLY USED BY STUDENTS

→ No pressure to get application in early, typically a Jan deadline for private schools with decisions March/April

*CEEB Code

- → An identification number assigned to high schools
- → 050819 → Union Mine High School CEEB Code

* Common Application ID (CAID)

→ 8 digit number that colleges use to match your material with your common app

*FERPA

- → The Family Educational Rights and Privacy ACT is a federal law that protects your educational records
- → Students are given an option to waive their right to access their recommendations
- → Waiving your rights shows colleges that student is not "afraid" of what is written
- → Some colleges may disregard letters if not waived

*Rolling Admissions

- → Colleges will review applications as they receive them as opposed to waiting to review all applications at one time
- → Submit your application as soon as possible with rolling admissions

Search California Community Colleges (CCC)

Basic Facts:

- 2 year public institutions, 116 total community colleges in California
- Offers Certificate degrees, Associate degrees or Associate Degrees for Transfer.
- <u>TAG (Transfer Admission Guarantee)</u> Transfer pathway for UC bound community college students.
- <u>ADT (Associates Degree for Transfer)</u> Transfer pathway for CSU bound community college students.
- Community Colleges <u>DO NOT</u> require SAT/ACT test scores.
- Community Colleges are Open Access. This means that once you apply, you are automatically accepted.

Paying for College: FAFSA/CADAA AKA Step 1

These applications are how you become eligible for Federal (country) and/or State (CA) Financial Aid.

Students should only complete one of the applications (not both), according to the citizenship requirements:

You are eligible to complete the FAFSA at www.fafsa.ed.gov if you are a:

- · U.S Citizen
- · Permanent Resident
- Eligible non-citizen
- T Visa holder

You are eligible to complete the CADAA at https://dream.csac.ca.gov if you are:

- Undocumented
- Have a valid or expired DACA
- · U Visa holders
- Have Temporary Protected Status (TPS)
- Meet the non-resident exemption requirements under AB 540

Both applications open October 1st and will use your parent/guardians 2019 tax return

Paying for College: College Scholarships

Some colleges will award scholarships automatically, based on your admission application

Other colleges may require you to submit supplemental materials and/or complete a specific scholarship application

Check each college website

- → Search for Freshman Scholarships
- → Or contact the Scholarship or Financial Aid Office once you have been accepted.

Do I Send a Transcript with My Application?

Self-Report Grades for UC and CSU:

- Students will send a final transcript (at the end of senior year)
- You will report grades earned, and classes currently enrolled in or planning to take next semester ("In progress" or "Planned")

Private Colleges

- Most require transcripts at the time of application
- Your counselor will send a transcript through Common App

Check with each college to see their requirements

Tips for Writing Your College Essay(s)

- 1. Answer the question being asked in the prompt
- 2. Tell the reader something <u>new</u>, not something already covered in your list of extracurricular activities
- 3. Be you use your voice
- 4. Edit and proofread your essay carefully

Building a College List

1. "Safety" Schools

- Acceptance rate 60% or higher
- Your academic profile is higher than their average
- Most likely will get into these schools

2. "Target" Schools

- Acceptance rate 30-60%
- Your academic profile matches that of their average student
- Optimistic that you will be accepted

3. "Reach" Schools

- o Low acceptance rate, less than 30%
- Your profile may be lower than that of the average student
- A stretch for majority of the students

Virtual Campus Tours





Did you know that colleges offer virtual campus tours. Try googling it!

Example: "Virtual tour of <u>Northern Arizona University</u>" Many colleges even have a dedicated YouTube channel.

You will want to apply to at least 4-6 total schools, with a combination of "safe", "target" and "reach" schools
