Test Structure	4 Test Sections (5 with the optional Writing Test): English, Math, Reading, Science, Writing (Optional),	2 Subject Areas Evidence-based Reading and writing, Math, (Optional Writing)
Test Philosophy	Informational	Reading across the curriculum
Reading	Reading Comprehension—4 passages with 10 questions per passage	Reading Comprehension—short and long passages from history or science Focus on complex structure and vocabulary
Math	Arithmetic, algebra, geometry, algebra II, and trigonometry	Application based, extended thinking, core competencies, theories, trigonometry
