Union Mine Music Department Beginning and Intermediate Instruments

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This course is designed for students interested in learning or improving their skills on a musical instrument. Students begin at their own level of understanding and work at a pace individually suited to their understanding of the instrument.

Students will be expected to improve their skills in reading music for their instruments, and must have a methods book using traditional musical notation (no tabs).

Daily Activities:

- Large group lessons: music theory, ear training, sight reading
 - Music theory lessons occur in class. Music theory packets will be given out and will be turned in upon the completion of the material.
- Small group lessons:
 - Teacher instructs family groups of instruments (strings, piano, etc.)
- Individual practice:
 - Students practice their instruments daily in class.

Grading:

Your grade is earned by the effort you put into your work and learning, and the quality of improvement, skill, and understanding you achieve. Grades are weighted by category – no matter the number of points assigned. Grades are computed by the computer and are not rounded up or down.

- Daily Work, including Participation & Behavior (40% of final grade)
 - 25% = Daily participation grades
 - being present in class and on time, with needed materials, appropriately participating in
 - 15% = Completion of worksheets and other assignments.
 - worksheets can be completed during class time or at home
 - learning activities and individual practice = 5 pts/day

- Assessments, including Performance and Music Theory (60% of final grade)
 - 20% = Music Theory Tests (as units are completed and midterm/final exams)
 - 40% = Performance Tests on assigned practice material (reading notation)
 - Weekly method book progress checks
 - Mid-term & Final individual recital performance
- Extra Credit very rarely, a very small amount of extra credit may be offered to the entire class. Extra credit will not be enough to greatly change a grade.

Behavior:

Students are expected to be respectful to the purpose of the course, the people in class and the classroom facilities.

- 1. The purpose of the course is to learn music; each student is expected to remain focused on the task of improving their ability to read music and play their instrument correctly. No other tasks are appropriate during class.
- 2. The people in the class include fellow students and the teacher; each student is expected to allow others to learn and practice their instruments; students are also to interact respectfully with the teacher by speaking politely and following directions and requests promptly, with a positive attitude.
- 3. The classroom facilities include all music rooms and the area around the music building, as well as all items within and outside the music building; students are expected to pick up after themselves and help others clean up, and not touch or play with items that do not belong to them we leave this room each day at least as neat as we find it.

Consequences:

Consequences will be adjusted as needed to encourage all students to make the best learning and behavior choices, and may follow the chart below

- 1. loss of participation points
- 2. time out from class and/or detention
- 3. parent call and/or referral to the office

Required Course Materials: students are required to provide and bring these items daily, along with any class handouts

- ✓ Pencil, lined paper, storage area for handouts (binder or folder)
- √ Instrument and appropriate accessories
 - Guitar and Bass: Instrument, strings, picks, tuner. No amps!
 - o **Strings:** Instrument, bow, rosin, chin rest
 - o **Brass:** Instrument, mouthpiece (Trumpet Bach 7C, Trombone Bach 12C), slide cream (trombone), valve oil
 - o Flute: Instrument, cleaning rod, handkerchief
 - Clarinet/Saxophone: Instrument, reeds (Vandoren Brand recommended, size 2 ½), cork grease, cleaning swab
 - o **Percussion:** Drum pad with stand, drum sticks (Vic Firth SD1)
 - o Piano: Earphones
- ✓ Instrumental method books (these titles are recommended, but not required*)
 - o Guitar: Hal Leonard Guitar Method Book 1, 2 or 3
 - o Bass: Alfred's Basic Bass Method
 - o Piano: Alfred's Basic Adult Piano Course
 - o Winds: Essential Elements 2000 (written for individual instruments)
 - o **Beginning Strings:** Strictly Strings (written for violin, viola, cello and string bass)
 - o **Drum Set:** Alfred's Beginning Drumset Method
